SWINGING BRIDGE

The original wooden one-lane bridge located here across the Frying Pan River was finished in 1880. Prior to 1908 the main wagon road into Aspen Junction/Basalt from the west followed High Street or Second Street, (Homestead Street) turned west onto Railroad Street (Main Street) and crossed the river here. The road continued on toward Aspen.

After being condemned for wagon use, in the fall of 1926 the Town Council voted to convert the bridge into a footbridge abandoning the road access. In March of 1927, Emery Arbaney milled four logs of proper length at a cost of \$16 to repair the footbridge, making the total cost of repair \$150.00. Almost every year in June flood waters washed out the north end of the wagon bridge which was used to reach the school.

During 1949-50, the Town of Basalt completely removed the wooden footbridge replacing it with a swinging bridge. The swinging bridge had a partial metal fencing along the sides of the wooden planks for safety. Before the Ruedi Dam was built, during high water run-off, the middle planks could have water running near or over them.

The two suspension cables of the swinging bridge were damaged by a fallen cottonwood tree in August of 2001. The swinging bridge would swing no more. It was replaced with aircraft-grade steel cables at a cost of \$75,000.00. The community dedication was on January 11, 2002.
